Notice re Archdiocesan Policy on Working With Children.

The Working With Children Check (WCC) is now extended also to Readers, Eucharistic Ministers and Collectors. There has been much discussion about the extension of the Checks beyond the Acolytes and Senior Servers, Youth and Kids' Church leaders within the Archdiocese with some feeling it was unnecessary. However, anecdotal evidence from one Church has shown the prudence in doing this and now it is a requirement of the Archdiocese, and we can be audited on the matter. All priests, Parish Office Workers, Teachers, of course, have had these checks for around three years now. While there is initially some inconvenience, it is a matter of great importance.

To get a WCC certificate: go on line to the *Working With Children Check -New South Wales Office of Children's Guardian* and follow the prompts. If you have difficulty with this, let us know in the Parish Office and we will help you.

Continuing readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be reminded by email. Some of you already have the WCC Check and will not need to re-apply. Collectors will be approached individually (a difficulty as some people are asked to be collectors on the spot, so to speak). In the week or two ahead we will recruit new Readers and Ministers of Holy Communion for Sunday Masses.

I repeat the curse of modern slavery cries out to us as individuals and communities, and that we must choose whether we will pass by on the other side like the priest and Levite, or stop and help like the Good Samaritan...In twenty years, when as a global community we look back on the progress that has been made on this issue, will people ask 'where was Australia?' or will they say 'Australia saw and acted?'"
