Kiribati Connection: I had an interesting debrief with Dominic Yang Hao Shi, the university graduate who spent a month at a new MSC School in Tarawa, Kiriabti teaching.

The New Translation of the Mass:

The Liturgy of the Word: apart from the Creed which we will look at below, there is only one change to the English texts of the Liturgy of the Word: it is the Response to the Proclamation of the Gospel – “The Gospel of the Lord”; All respond: “Glory to you **O** Lord.” It is the “**O**” which reflects the Latin Vocative case that is being translated. [One may ask, how often we use “O” before speaking to someone, other than as an exclamation!] The inclusion of “O” here is to give added reverence to the response.

The Response to “The Word of the Lord” remains, “Thanks be to God.”

If a Deacon is assisting at Mass, he goes to the Celebrant and bows and asks for a blessing. The words he uses are slightly changed, as are the words the priest prays prior to proclaiming the Gospel: these texts are prayed inaudibly and so are of no issue to the congregation.

The Creed: You will notice more changes in this English text than elsewhere in the Mass. This is the Nicene Creed – fashioned by the Council of Nicea in 323. There is, of course, another Creed, approved for use at Mass, but which we do not use, “The Apostles’ Creed”- more often said to begin the Rosary.

And so, the changes:

“**I believe**” is a literal translation of the Latin “**Credo**”, and replaces the present “**We believe**” **throughout the new translation.** (Spanish speakers, for example, have been saying “I believe” since Vatican II.) I have to confess to a love of the Latin Credo, any of the Plainsong chant versions, but especially Gounod’s *Mass in Honour of St Cecilia* – the CD can be heard in our Church on Pentecost night following the 6.00pm Mass. Gounod’s setting of the *Credo* is truly magnificent – but I digress.

“**Of all things visible and invisible**” replaces “Seen and unseen”, and corresponds to the Latin “visibilium omnium et invisibilium”.

“**The only Begotten Son of God**” ...replaces “The only Son of God.”

“**Born of the Father before all ages**”...replaces “eternally begotten of the Father.”

“**Consubstantial with the Father**”... replaces “one in Being with the Father.”

“**and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary**”... replaces “by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary.”

“**he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.**” .. replaces “He suffered, died, and was buried. On the third day he rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures.

“**he is adored and glorified who has spoken through the prophets**”... replaces “he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets”

“**I confess one baptism...**” replaces “We acknowledge one baptism...”

“**and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead...**” replaces “We look for...”

**Antioch: Recruitment Weekend: Friday eve-
ning 25th March, Saturday and Sunday. At
OLSH School Randwick.** Participants are bil-
leted Friday and Saturday nights in small groups
in Parishioners' Homes. Following the Weekend,
meetings will be on Friday evenings – maybe
6.00 or 6.30pm in **Ventnor** leaving time for
youth to socialize afterwards. Presently we have
11 new recruits, and we are aiming for around 20
which will help form a community of 30 or so.
Antioch will be one of the few environments
where youth are not exposed to alcohol and
drugs..

Antioch is a **youth peer to peer, parish based**
group for 16 years olds (around Year 10/11) to a
couple of years after High School. There is **adult
supervision**, and life long friendships are often
made together with a wider world of contacts
with other Australian groups.

What happens at an Antioch Meeting: friend-
ships are made within a Catholic youth context;
each week one of the members presents a pre-
pared topic: eg – friendships, commitment, on
criticism, fear and hope, life's hurts, judgments,
listening, freedom, the power of praise, sense of
fairness, service, talking with God, Mary Mother
of Jesus...inputs that aim to build character and
Catholic life, community and service. There are
discussions, social gatherings and outreach. It is
formative of young Catholics who are empow-
ered to be involved in the Church and Christ's
mission: i.e. it is unashamedly Catholic.

vidual and builds up the Church community, **con-
