

Welcome to the NEW TRANSLATION of the Liturgy.

We began the new translation on Holy Souls Day during the week. In general we coped quite well with it. The priests have much to get used to with the new versions of Prefaces and Eucharistic Prayers – however, time, I trust, will ease the unfamiliarity.

The laminated “pew cards” do fit into the slots for the hymn books – can we make sure that they are tucked into bed there after each Mass – otherwise the Church looks like a whirl-wind (not the Pentecost Holy Spirit wind) has swept through and scattered things - not a nice look.

CHRISTMAS MASSES: The leaders of choirs had a meeting to prepare for Christmas. As there are ten Masses on Christmas day including the vigils at OLSH and SMM, it is quite an effort to provide music.

CHOIR PRACTICES for the Midnight Mass will begin on Monday week – November 14th allowing us 7 sessions. We especially need tenors and bases—see Fr Peter.

SACRED HEART SPIRITUALITY: We have had four sessions – all very beautiful and prayerful, with two more to go. We have 94 registered for it, and attendance has been pretty faithful – I notice that the alternative wine and cheese nights are very faithfully attended – is there a Cana lesson in that? The really fine thing about these sessions is that three of the six will have been, delivered by three of our young adults. This is so important that lay people have that opportunity to gain facility in these areas.

At the conclusion of the Spirituality Sessions I will survey the attendees to see if there is any interest in developing the program – I am thinking, for example, that it could easily grow into a “Home Retreat” over 6 weeks – sounds formidable – but with a weekly meeting for an hour – brief input, prayer and journal time; with 6 little Bible quotes/ideas for a daily 15 minute prayer time at home or on the bus or while having a bath...; and once or twice over the 6 weeks, meet with a prayer companion (maybe a priest or holy nun or lay person with experience in these matters – not that the former two categories, as categories, are necessarily adept at the business of discernment) to more closely discern the beautiful ways of God in our lives... however, just a dream at present.

When I can get a night free, the BIBLE STUDY core group will meet to plan remotely for next year – Gospel of Mark – which happens to be the Year of Mark in the Liturgical Year. So the two will be in step.

I look forward to both – the first to give us some privacy in the MSC ‘monastery’ home of ours, and the latter as a beautiful gathering place for barbeques, cake stalls... just think how our 125 Year After Mass get-togethers would have been enhanced with a cloister to sit in and sip our wine and juice and eat our half ton of sausages... what a dream to make come true. I warmly commend this to you.

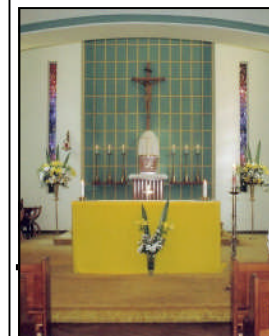
