7 EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP.

This includes the ability to influence others, initiate projects and co-ordinate the efforts of a team of others. An aspect of leadership is the ability to deal with conflict and negotiate solutions. It is also valuable to be able to understand group dynamics. A good leader is assertive rather than passive or aggressive or both.

8 RELATIONSHIP STABILITY.

In essence this involves getting on with others. This includes the ability to have stable and satisfying relationships. An important skill is to deal with interpersonal conflict without cutting off emotionally. There is also a willingness to be committed.

9 THE ABILITY TO CONTROL IMPULSES.

This includes not taking unnecessary risks, being measured in spending money, and being careful in sensitive situations. This is at the root of all emotional control.

10 A CAPACITY TO DELAY GRATIFICATION.

This includes such qualities as saving money, studying, working at a steady job and accepting personal responsibility. Such a person is a self-starter or motivated for personal reasons. It is obvious that success has a lot to do with achieving *attainable* goals.

11 A DEFINED CHARACTER.

This includes moral values, courage, honesty, integrity, and a sense of what is right and wrong. All this profoundly influences behaviour.

12 SPIRITUALITY.

This adds another dimension of meaning, purpose and commitment. Evidence of a mature spirituality includes a sense of justice, compassion, and a willingness to make sacrifices for others. There is often a connection with others in worship.

There is some good news in all this. IQ may be largely in the genes, but EQ is learned and developed. As we know, a high IQ is no guarantee of prosperity, prestige or happiness in life, but emotional intelligence may well shape our personal destiny.

Further: Better decision-making comes from a balance between HEAD AND HEART – Our hearts can be shaped by the Spirituality of the Sacred Heart, which is at the heart of the Gospels and the Church. Our Mission “**To be on Earth the Heart of Jesus**”. Peter Hearn MSC
