

Walk with Christ Procession – Sunday 3 June 2018. Begins corner Pitt St & Martin Pl, 2.30pm. Concludes at Cathedral around 3.30pm with Adoration and Benediction. A Book for you to write your intentions in is on the foyer table. The procession will help mark the **200th anniversary** of a little known, but most heroic and faith-filled time in the history of the Australian Church. **In 1818, the Government forcibly removed the only Catholic priest in Australia, Fr Jeremiah O’Flynn, from Sydney.** Fr O’Flynn’s last pastoral act was to leave the Blessed Sacrament reserved in a faithful Catholic’s home so that the colonists and prisoners could come to adore Christ present there. **For two years, the Blessed Sacrament, in this lay Sydney home, was the source and centre of worship and consolation for the priestless Catholics of the Australian colony.**

Greetings on the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity: This feast day of the Trinity well illustrates the incomparable Mystery of God. Theologians speak of the circumincessio – the mutual coinhering of the Three Persons of the Trinity. To put it a little more “simply”: in God there are three distinct Persons, equal in majesty, One in Being, undivided in splendour, yet One Lord, one God.” (Preface of the Trinity.) The foundations of the Doctrine of the Trinity are, of course, the discourses of Jesus recorded in the Gospels. The Church over the early centuries, especially at the Council of Nicea in 325, had to grapple with the complexity of integrating the notion of three persons but maintaining the integrity of the One God of Revelation to Israel. (“Listen Israel, the Lord our God is one God...Dt 6:4). ‘Each Person of the Trinity is God, whole and entire. They are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: as the Fourth Lateran Council declared “it is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds.” While distinct in their relations with one another, they are one in all else. The whole work of creation and grace is a single operation common to all three divine persons, who at the same time operate according to their unique properties, so that all things are from the Father, through the Son and in the Holy Spirit.’ We are blessedly pleased to speak of God who has revealed in Jesus this mystery of the inner life of the loving Communion of Divine Persons to us. In Jesus we learn that God desires to share the Divine Life with each of us: ‘make your home in me as I make mine in you’; ‘the Father and I are one’, ‘we shall come and make our home in you...’ - words so filled with God’s desire for intimacy with his people. May we allow God to embrace us in love. Our liturgical life is meant to draw us into the Mystery of this transcendent yet immanent and intimate God. The Eastern Churches have a strong sense of our being taken up into the life of God – the process called *divinization*. Prayerful reflection upon the Mystery of the Trinity may induce in us adoration and awe together with a joyful sense of wonder at the humility of God to be so close to us in love. In stillness may we sense the grandeur and humble Presence of God for and in each of us. PHMSC

Spirituality of Jules Chevalier

"Let us be prepared to suffer everything for the love of the Heart of Jesus and for the salvation of other: hunger, thirst poverty, dangers, persecutions, death itself if necessary." 1877 Constitutions [Probably seems extreme to us for this to be written into a Constitution of a Religious Community – but not long afterwards the first expulsions of male religious and confiscations of their properties occurred in France. And within four years the first major MSC-OLSH overseas mission began to PNG and Central Pacific – extreme poverty was experienced by the first groups of MSC-OLSH in those places. From 1904 – 1985 around 140 MSC were killed during wars and revolutions in various countries, especially during WWII – so the sentiments in that Constitution have been truly born out in subsequent history.)
