Welcome to the beginning of the New Liturgical Year, the First Sunday of Advent.

ADVENT - Year C: The Year of Luke.

In contrast to either Mark or Matthew, Luke's gospel is clearly written more for a gentile audience. He has an educated style and the work is written for educated Gentile (non-Jewish) people.

He endeavours to show that non-Jews can belong to God's elect, be included in God's plan for salvation. Eg. Luke has Jesus praising the faith of a Roman centurion a non-Jew, and he makes a good Samaritan the exemplar of a parable of mercy.

Other minorities or marginalized groups also take centre stage in Luke: the role of women and the poor are highlighted.

Another major theme in Luke is the compassion of Jesus for the outcasts and sinners: Zacchaeus, and the thief crucified beside Jesus being examples.

One of Luke's major concerns is to show that the work, passion, crucifixion, and resurrection of Jesus are the fulfillment of the Jewish scriptures (i.e., Moses, the prophets, and the Psalms).

Luke is traditionally thought of as one of Paul's traveling companions and it's certainly the case that the author of Luke was from those Greek cities in which Paul had worked.

The author has used as his sources the gospel of Mark, the sayings collection called Q [quell = source], and a collection of material of his own.

Bible scholars generally agree that the Gospel of Luke was written around 70-75 A.D.

December 8th: Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

In 1884, Fr Chevalier, a young curate at Issoudun, France, began a Novena (9 days prayer) on November 30th to conclude on December 8th, the day in Rome when the Pope declared as a dogma of the Church, the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

Fr Chevalier's intention was to seek the intercession of Mary with regard to founding a society of Missionaries dedicated to the Heart of Jesus.

His prayer was answered on the very last morning of the Novena when funds came through which enabled him to begin. In gratitude to Mary he dedicated the Missionaries to her under the title of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart.

This date has been the foundation day of the MSC.

Let us seek her intercession in the same spirit of trust, hope and love.
